What does it regulate?



Educational leisure activities (some of which are sports activities)



in which more than four children under the age of 18 take part





Educational leisure activities



Sports activities



Holiday camp

Any activity that takes place during the school holidays, normally from Monday to Friday, without any continuity during the rest of the year, with no overnight stay involved.



Sports camp

Holiday camp where the main purpose of the educational activity is to train in and practice one or more



Holiday residence

Activity that includes overnight stay/s in a building, house or other permanent facility.



'Stage' or sports campus

Holiday residence where the main purpose of the educational activity is to train in and practice one or more sports.



Route covered on foot or by bicycle during which, in general, each night is spent in a different location. It is conducted by an entity registered with the Census of Youth Associations of the Directorate General for Youth.



Sports trail

Hike that includes one or more physical and sporting activities in the outdoors. It is carried out by an entity that is not registered with the Census of Youth Associations.



Youth camp

Activity involving an overnight stay in the outdoors, under cover or in tents.



Fieldwork project

Activity during which the participants voluntarily take part in a task of social or community interest or collaborate on collective, non-profit projects with the aim of contributing to social transformation.



Family activities.

Activities carried out by schools within the school terms.

Regular sports activities different from the ones described (such as competitions, training, coaching conferences, etc.).

Activities for children and adolescents organized by residential and foster care centres, by nonresidential socio-educational intervention services and by the staff of juvenile justice schools and open detention facilities.

Activities undertaken by the Youth Section of the fire brigade.

Regular activities organised by the play centres of public administrations.

People involved in these activities



TEAM OF MONITORS:

Comprising the activity leader and the monitors. All of them must be adults and be present while the activity is being carried out.



Activity leader: is responsible for carrying out the activity in accordance with its programme, during the established time and in the



Monitor: directly carries out the activities with the participants.



LOGISTICS SUPPORT PERSONNEL:

People who help to ensure the satisfactory running of the activity looking after



PARTICIPANTS:

Children and young people under the age of 18 that enjoy the activities.



established place.

Obligations of the person responsible: To comply and ensure compliance with the provisions of this Decree.

- To ensure that the relevant notification of the activity is sent, as well as any cancellations or modifications that occur afterwards.
- To facilitate the inspection and monitoring of the activity by the personnel duly authorized to undertake this task.
- To guarantee the execution of the activity programme.
- To ensure that the activity is conducted in accordance with the appropriate health and safety conditions.
- To ensure that the participants respect the property, facilities and natural environment of the location where the activity takes place, and to avoid any risk of forest fires.
- To guarantee that all participants are aware of the emergency action
- To ensure compliance with all current legislation on alcoholic drinks and tobacco.
- To ensure compliance with the relevant laws whenever the organization of any activity is undertaken by a specialist organization or company.





They must be adults; though they can be aged between 16 and 18 provided that:

There is a two-year gap between them and the oldest participant.

They do not exceed 10% of the participants, and to a maximum of 5 staff.

There is always one member of logistics support team aged over 18.



Equivalence of qualifications



MONITOR means having at least one of these qualifications:



Diploma as a leisure activity monitor for children and young people issued by the Directorate-General for Youth.
Professional certificate as an invigilator of leisure activities



for children and young people.

LEADER means having at least one of these qualifications:




- Diploma as an activity leader of leisure activities for children and young people issued by the Directorate-General for Youth.

- Technical or higher degree in socio-cultural and tourist


















Notification of activities



The following activities must be notified:

Activities WITHOUT an overnight stay



Activities WITH an overnight stay



4 or more consecutive days

(holiday or sports camp)

2 or more consecutive nights

(holiday residence or 'stage' or sports campus, hike or sports trail, camp and fieldwork project)



Deadline for submitting notifications

The activity must be notified as soon as possible





ELECTRONICALLY



IN PERSON WITH A NOTIFICATION FORM

All the details of the form, specially the contact information, have to be precise, in order to be able to act properly in a case of an emergency.

The cancellation or modification of the details of an activity must be notified before the start date of the activity.

Mixed activities

When an activity includes one or more activities of a different type, but which are also governed by this Decree, the other activities must also comply with its provisions.

Where do the activities have to take place?



Holiday residence/ 'stage' or sports campus

They have to take place in facilities listed in the Register of Facilities for Youth activities.



Youth camp, hike, fieldwork project

Sufficient services and health and safety measures must be guaranteed. Property permission is required.

Which mandatory documentation is needed during the activity?

- Programme of the activity, indicating its objectives, schedule, timings and daily planning.
- Signed authorizations for every participant under adult age.
- Signed health form of every participant under adult age, detailing any possible physical or mental impediments, diseases, medication, updated details of vaccinations...
- An alphabetical list of the names, addresses and telephone numbers of all the participants in the activity.
- A health ID card of every participant.
- A proof of insurance policies.
- In the case of the activities that have to be notified:
 - A copy of the notification.



Civil liability insurance providing a minimum compensation of:

6.000 € per medical expenses 5.000 € per death 6.500 € per permanent disability

300.000 € per victim 1.200.000 € per incident In the case of the sports activities. the insurances obligations are stipulated by their own regulation.

Accessibility



When the activities involve participants with disabilities, the organizer must evaluate the case in question to adjust the ratio of the team of monitors.



The organizers or promoters of the activities must progressively guarantee accessibility to people with physical, sensorial or intellectual disabilities.
